## How to Avoid the 10 Most Common Coiling Doors RFI's - 1 AIA/CES Learning Units/ HSW

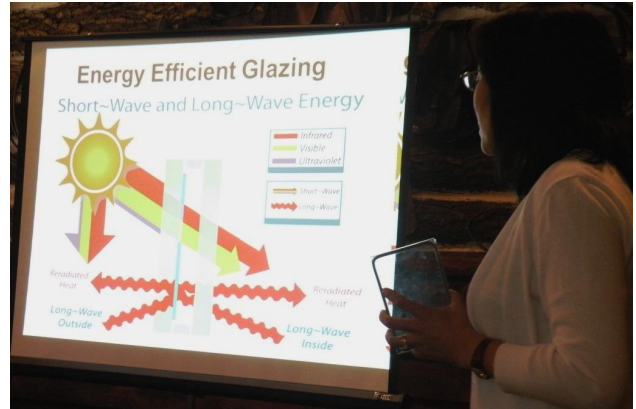

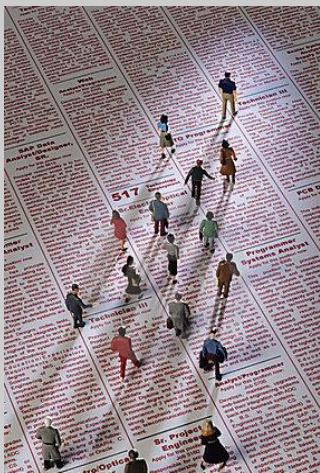
